Public Relations Officer Report 2016

It has been a tough year for bass fishing in Namibia with the ongoing drought resulting in very low water levels in our dams. This resulted in 4 of the competitions of the year being cancelled.

A total of 4 National Competitions where all hosted at Lake Oanob as well as the National Trials. Bank Windhoek was the main sponsor of these events together with Deep Catch (Score Energy Drink). Below is a list of the number of Anglers per event:

National Development Event

A new event was added to the NBAA Calendar this year. A National Team development Event was held at De Hoop Dam in South Africa. There were 5 anglers from the NBAA present at this event. These anglers included; Neil Engelbrecht, Nic Kruger, Pierre Fourie, Ricardo Abrantes and Reinhardt Lagner. Experienced anglers who are or have been part of the SA national team each took an angler on their boat and shared some of their knowledge with them. This is also a good social event with interaction between NBAA and SABAA members.

Cancelled Events

Among the events cancelled this year were the famous Summer Bass Classic, the Christmas Cup and 2 National Competitions. The rainfall prediction for 2017 seems to be very positive and we hope that these events will return to our calendar in 2017. The Summer Bass Classic is an event from which the NBAA has a tremendous financial benefit. The cancellation of this event had a very negative effect on the fundraising for the NBAA budget; it is also one of the best attended events for the NBAA with very active media coverage provided by Radiowave, giving us tremendous exposure to the public.



NBAA Golf Day

The NBAA hosted its annual golf day on the 13th of May at the Windhoek Country Club. This is one of the biggest fund raising events the NBAA has during the year. We managed to get a total of 10 teams for the golf day. National team anglers are each expected to get a team to enter the competition. This fundraiser is crucial to collect funds for the national team to compete at the region 5 tournament. The costs of the Region 5 tournament have escalated by almost 20% year on year over the past 4 years and without this funding, the national anglers have to finance a great deal out of their own pocket.

Corporate Bass Challenge

The annual CBC was held at Lake Oanob from the 23rd till the 25th of September. **Old Mutual** once again was the main sponsor of this event along with **Bushwhackers**, **Tyrerack**, **Surf and Turf** and **Deep Catch** (Score Energy drink and Glenbrynth whiskey) who generously sponsored some prizes. Part of the national team's responsibility is to avail their boats and tackle and act as skippers for the teams. There is also an auction after the prize giving event on the final evening. All proceeds go towards the NBAA.

It was the first time that the Namibian team had a manager on the water. This role was fulfilled by Dr. Andre van Vuuren. Fishing conditions where tough as the anglers were hit with cold fronts. Zimbabwe managed to win the competition with Namibia ending 5th. This event is the pinnacle of each bass anglers fishing career. It offers international exposure to the anglers and the NBAA.

Fundraiser Omeya Golf Day

The NBAA also hosted a fun day at Omeya golf course on the 3rd of November to raise funds for Alec and Neil who attended the B.A.S.S Nation qualifier. Only 5 teams attended the event but it was a successful test run of something that could evolve into a much bigger event on the NBAA calendar. Heidi Englebrecht was the driving force behind this event and the NBAA would like to thank her for all her effort and input.

B.A.S.S Nation Championship

The BASS Nation Championship was held at lake Conroe, Texas USA from the 17th of November. Neil Engelbrecht represented Namibia as the Boater and for the first time the NBAA sent a non-boater to the event as well. This year it was Alec Williams who went as the non-boater. This is a very prestigious event that gives the anglers and the NBAA great international exposure.

Radio Advertising: Radiowave sponsors airtime to the NBAA to promote special events and raise awareness of the NBAA.







The Namibia Bass Angling Association (NBAA) hosted the Bank Windhoek National NBAA Competition, attracting a field of 20 boats with 20 anglers at Lake Oanob outside Rehoboth last weekend.

Tough fishing conditions – combined with a cold front that hit central Namibia on the Friday and Saturday, anglers were left to face freezing and windy conditions – were also not helped by the low water levels, which created highly challenging fishing conditions.

However, the anglers braved the chilly conditions and still managed to catch a fair amount of fish, with Fernando Abrantes' catching the biggest fish of the day and setting a new personal best in the process.

His son, Ricardo, only joined the NBAA late last year and has faced tough fishing excursions due to the very low dam levels, which has dominated the weather conditions in the country of late.

Nevertheless, Fernando persevered and managed to catch a personal best during an official competition and a massive haul of 16 fish made it to the scale with a total weight for the tourney hitting 25.107-kg.



"It's with great excitement that we announce that this was the first tourney at which we could showcase and use our new weighing station. The weigh station has been mooted for many years now and the NBAA started construction at the beginning of this year.

"Last weekend was a test run for the weigh station and it certainly passed with flying colours," said an excited chairman of the NBAA Richard Grant. "We now need to add the final touches and branding after which the NBAA will have one of the best weigh stations in the world of bass fishing.

"The NBAA would like to thank Nic Kruger from KTE Namibia for building the actual weigh station and for sponsoring material, hard work, sweat, blood and tears to get it done," Grant said. It also applauded all its other loyal sponsors that helped making the dream of a world class weigh station a reality.

This was the last national competition for the year. Next up is the Bank Windhoek National Trials on October 22 and 23, where the national team for 2017 will be selected. "We would once again like to thank our main sponsor, Bank Windhoek, for their loyal support and continued contribution to bass angling in Namibia," Grant concluded.

Sy grootse baars van 2.595 kg was ook die swaarste van die hele kompetisie.

The Namibia Bass Angling Association hosted the 1st Bank Windhoek National Tournament Trail Competition at Lake Oanob nearby Rehoboth on the 6th of February 2016. Expectations were high after an extremely tough fishing year in 2015. The Bank Windhoek National Tournament Trail consists of 6 competitions, which will be hosted throughout the course of 2016. The results of the Bank Windhoek National Competitions are used to determine the Namibian National Team, which will represent Namibia at the Region 5 Bass Angling Championships in 2017, as well as the anglers that will represent Namibia at the B.A.S.S. (Bass Anglers Sportsman's Society) Nation Championships in the United States of America in 2017.

A total of 27 anglers arrived at the launch ramp at Lake Oanob eager to get the day underway so that they can set off to catch that big fish. Captain's meeting was held at 06:30 in which new members were welcomed and the rules for the day were explained to all.



The tough fishing prevailed on the day with only 2 anglers managing to catch a limit and stories of the big ones that got away echoed all around the weigh station.

The biggest fish of the day was caught by James weighing in at 2.501 kg. James's summary of the competition is as follows:

In practice I had found 2 patterns, so when the tournament started I decided to run to some of the shallow banks and I was throwing a shallow running crank. I fished this until about 9:30 and got 4 small keepers doing this! I was using Shimano Akrab cranking rod with Curado reels. I was using 2 different setups one had 8lb Torray Flouro and the other had 10lb. I was using a 4-6ft diving depth crank in a custom painted tilapia color.

At 9:30 I knew the water had warmed enough for my second pattern to start working. I fished a variety of deeper areas where there were large boulders at 16-25ft. That was the key to the deep bite was the size of the boulders! My Lowrance Electronics played a big key on this pattern! I was using a drop shot rig that I fished straight up and down. I was using a G-Loomis drop shot rod paired with a Stella and 6lb Torray Fluoro! I used a 1/2oz ball drop shot sinker with a number 1 Trokar drop shot hook. I used 3 baits on the drop shot. 4" finesse worm, 4" Senko, 5" hand poured finesse worm. Best color was Aaron's magic.

I got both the 2,5kg fish and the 1,58kg all off one Boulder and in a short space of time. I got +-15 keepers on the drop shot and did lose 2 really big fish that I could not hold on the 6lb. The main area was between Jürgen's bay and the S-Bend. I had caught all those fish before 11:30.

Alec's summary of the day is as follows:

I used a mojo rigged Big Bite Cane Thumper in Green Pumpkin as well as a Zoom Fluke in Junebug and Watermelon Candy. Found keepers by sifting through small fish on a main lake point in about 25 feet of water. And there you have it. The next time you are out on the water, try to replicate what James and Alec did!!!!!

The biggest fish of the day was caught by Jacques weighing in at 2.053 kg.

Alec's summary of the competition is as follows:

The fishing was tough and the spots were limited. When I eventually managed to get to my spot I decided to stay there for a while (most of the day) and it worked out well for me. I caught most of my fish on the Big Bite Cane Thumper in Green Pumpkin and a Zoom Junior Fluke in Junebug colour. I was fishing finesse with a very light mogo rig.

The sensitivity of the Falcon Rod I was using really helped me detect the most subtle bites and the Seagar Flourocarbon helped me land my fish in the rockiest terrain.

Jacques' summary of the competition is as follows:

I caught all my fish on a 5 inch Senko in Watermelon Black Flake and Baby Bass Colour. I found the fish on the flats in 5 foot

Neels' summary of the competition is as follows:

My approach to the day was to start shallow and search for active fish on shallow flats near deeper water and river beds, I targeted the flats using soft plastic jerk baits and shallow to medium running crank baits. I tried this till about 8:30 after not getting any keeper fish on the flat, I fell back to my second pattern that worked very well on the practice weekend.

I dropped back and fished deeper water humps, ledges en boat docks with finesse style baits and deep diving crank baits. I've started getting more bites. The key was to get a keeper or almost keeper fish to bite and then stay on that spot and then just rotate your baits. As the fish were schooled up and once you located a school you just needed to stay with it.

The fishing was a grind and you had to work hard to get that first fish and locate the school, after I located the school I caught 3 keepers within 10 minutes. I allocated the school next to a shallow ledge dropping from 4ft to 10ft of water.

My tackle that I was using was, 7ft MH spinning rod rigged with BWG's 12lbs Maji Kamba braid and a 10 lbs Roho Kamba Fluorocarbon leader. I've used a bit thicker leader line as I was fishing a drop shot rig vertically and didn't want to get broken off on every second cast.

I've used a 1/8 oz barrel lead weight and a 1/0 drop shot hook. I had 3 baits that I rotated through out the day, Xcite Baits SlimX worm in Sprayed Grass color, Zoom Super Fluke Jr in Baby Bass color and Zoom Finesse worm in Baby Bass Color.

Sonita's summary of the day is as follows:

I used a Carolina rig 3/8oz with 14 pound flouro line and a Junebug UV Baby Brush Hog. I caught both fish early morning while it was still overcast.

And there you have it. The next time you are out on the water, try to replicate what Alec, Jacques, Neels and Sonita did.

The biggest fish of the day was caught by Fernando weighing in at 3.256 kg and was also his personal best.

James's summary of the competition is as follows:

I caught my fish on a drop shot rig with a 4" fineness worm on a Gloomis drop shot rod with an aldebaran and 6lb Fluro. I targeted 12 – 14' of water with the drop shot. I caught one fish a river2sea s waver swimbait on a 7.7 nrx with a Calais and 16lb Gamma Fluro. The fish on the swimbait was caught in a shallow bay.



Anton's summary of the competition is as follows:

Early morning we first started in the back of a bay where we previously located fish and saw cruising fish prior to the competition. That did not work out as planned. We moved out of the bay to a part of the dam where there is shallow water near deep water forming part of the main lake. There I managed to pick up a good fish but unfortunately the fish broke the line. Dumb mistake for not checking the line for rock damage. I left that area and tried to get the same in other parts of the dam. Unfortunately that did also not work out as planned. After we had a quick lunch we returned to our first spot. We moved along the bay in 12 to 15 feet of water managed to catch a keeper in 4 to 6 feet of water just after 2 o'clock in the afternoon. After spending time in deeper water we returned back to the same depth and I managed to catch the 2.8 Kg fish. Both were caught on zoom paddle tail in junebug colour. I slow rolled the



paddle tail on both occasions and that seemed to work for me. The water temperature was about 65

degree in the afternoon as to 60 degree early morning.



Fernando's summary of the day is as follows:

Not having time to practice much for the competition we fished 4 weeks before the time. We located fish on the out skirts of possible spawning bays and on points. We got 2 nice fish in these areas. So when we started preparing, we tied rigs as we suspected it to be a similar bite due to fish being close to spawn and a cold front passing on competition day. I insisted to tie on a white swim jig with a white paddle tail trailer as this what worked in the practice session. I slowly rolled the jig over rocks just ticking the tops, this method landed both fish in our boat in the competition. We fished gradually slopping banks in the morning sun from 15ft water casting to banks passing ledges and points.

James's summary of the competition is as follows:

I caught my fish sight fishing with a gan craft swimbait on 20lb gamma Fluro with a Gloomis swimbait rod and curado 300 reel fishing shallow bays.



Alec's summary of the day is as follows:

I caught all three fish a mojo rigged plastic fishing deep points. I don't have much more to elaborate on as I feel most of it was luck.

Thinus's summary of the day is as follows:

In practice I found fish in the first 1/3 of bays which indicated that fish was starting to look at possible spawning places in bays. I marked these places and other possible "good" areas on my map and decided to rotate these areas in the tournament.

On tournament day I started in the shallows with a Spro frog and pitching structure with a finesse jig. I did not find any activity shallow and started fishing deeper rock points close to marked areas where I lost a nice fish on the jig. Word on the water was that everyone was having a tough tournament - I decided to continue fishing



points and bluff walls for the rest of the day targeting staging fish and was rewarded with a fish over 3kg (duma

fish) in the last 15minutes at the dam wall area using a green pumpkin super hog texas rigged.

This put me in first position after day one. On day 2 when i put my trolling motor into the water it unfortunately did not work and I could only fish one area where the wind was not bothering me resulting in no fish being weighed.
