Article 4: Objects, Aims, Activities and Responsibilities

4.1. The angling year of the association will start with the first scheduled tournament of a calendar year and end with the last scheduled tournament of a calendar year.

Article 5: Membership

Membership application to the association is done, by filling in and submitting the below forms to the chairman, the tournament director or the secretary of the association.

5.1. Namibia Bass Angling Association Membership Application Form (Annexure 1). This form is also available to complete at www.nbaanamibia.com .

5.2. B.A.S.S. Club Members Application Form (Annexure 2) has become obsolete. All NBAA members automatically become B.A.S.S. members. The NBAA registers and pays all B.A.S.S. membership fees.



Explanation:

It is very important that the Region is clearly indicated on the application form. The region is linked to the Anglers current region of residence. When an angler moves to a new region, his / her affiliation must be changed in the association records. A written document to the chairman and / or the tournament director explaining the change of region, the reason and the commencement date, are necessary.

Article 6: Finances

6.1. Finances and funds generated by fundraiser events, sponsorships, benefits tournaments, sanctioned tournaments etc. are generated by the organizers / coordinators within the association, for the benefit of the association.

6.2. Funds required by national association teams, regional teams, federation teams as well as (but not limited to) international teams, are to be applied for by the management of these teams, to the executive management committee of the association, by means of a written request.

6.3. Funds requests forwarded by any team must be accompanied by a preliminary budget, detailing the anticipated costs of the event and an allocation of expenditure.

Article 7: Management

7.1. Duties and Responsibilities of the Chairman

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the chairman of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio:

7.1.1. Chair the Captains Meeting, if the Tournament Director is not available, at each tournament in accordance with the set out in the Captains Meeting Agenda, as per Agenda (Annexure 5).

7.1.2. Assign himself / herself or another person as tournament director for a specific tournament, should the association's tournament director not be present.

7.2. Duties and Responsibilities of the Vice-Chairman

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the vice-chairman of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio:

7.2.1. Chair the Captains Meeting at each tournament in accordance with the set out in the Captains Meeting Agenda, as per Agenda (Annexure 5) should the chairman or the tournament director not be available.

7.2.2. Assign himself / herself or another person as tournament director for a specific tournament should the association's tournament director or the chairman not be present.

7.2.3. Perform tasks, within reason, allocated by the chairman.

7.3. Duties and Responsibilities of the Secretary

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the secretary of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his / her portfolio:

7.3.1. Perform tasks allocated within reason by the chairman, the vice-chairman, the treasurer and the tournament director.

7.4. Duties and Responsibilities of the Treasurer

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the Treasurer of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio:

7.4.1. To ensure that all membership fees are received in full, by the date as set at the association's annual general meeting.

7.4.2. Perform tasks, within reason, allocated by the chairman or secretary.

7.5. Duties and Responsibilities of the Conservation Officer

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the conservation officer of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio

7.5.1. See Annexure 7 for full duties and responsibilities of the conservation officer.

7.5.2. Perform tasks, within reason, allocated by the chairman.

7.6. Duties and Responsibilities of the Tournament Director

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the Tournament Director of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio:

7.6.1. Ensure that all tournaments are run in accordance with the association's Tournament Rules and Regulations.

7.6.2. Ensure that all tournament results are shared with all executive committee members as well as all NBAA members.

7.6.3. Register record claims, which must be submitted to the tournament director for verification. Applications for the registration of record claims must be submitted within ninety (90) days after the record fish or record heaviest bag was caught.

7.6.3. Provide the publicity official / development officer / secretary with all tournament results, and record claims, within ten (10) days, to facilitate for the public relation officer's public / newspaper coverage reports.

7.6.4. Be responsible for the associations weigh-master, weighing scales, weigh-in bags, tag-board, buoys, starter horn, official clock, length ruler and other items relevant to the weigh-in station and ensure that all tournament weigh-ins are run according to the prescribed weigh-in procedure, as laid out in Procedure 1.

7.6.5. Be responsible to have the associations scale certified once annually.

7.6.6. Ensure that a copy of the association's constitution, house rules and annexures, are present at each tournament.

7.6.7. Perform tasks, within reason, allocated by the chairman.

7.7. Duties and Responsibilities of the Public Relations Officer

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the development officer of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio

7.7.1. Manage and update the association's website and all social media platforms.

7.7.2. Perform tasks, within reason, allocated by the chairman.

7.8. Duties and Responsibilities of the Development Officer

Apart from the duties and responsibilities laid out in the association's constitution, the development officer of the NBAA shall have the following duties and responsibilities under his portfolio

7.8.1. See Annexure 18 for full duties and responsibilities of the development officer.

7.8.1. Perform tasks, within reason, allocated by the chairman.

7.9. National Selection Committee

Only members who are in good standing with the association will be considered for team nomination. (NBAA Constitution Article 7.20)

7.9.A. National Association Team

7.9.A.1. The national selection committee may determine a national association team, which may consist of any members of the association anglers (irrespective of nationality) who are in good standing in the association and who:

- a) Are in the top of the ranking of the association in the current angling year,
- b) Who have competed in the last national championships.

7.9.A.2. National association team nomination (if required) will be given (in order of points accumulated) to an angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) Current points of the best, as a percentage (out of 100) last three (3) out of eight (8) tournaments fished. This may include tournaments dating back into the previous angling year.

Added to:

- b) Points achieved in the last national association championship held.

c) If, by using the prescribed ratios to calculate the scores, anglers are tied on points then the angler that caught the biggest bag out of all ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. If the heaviest bag weights result in another tie then the anglers that caught the heaviest fish during the NBAA ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. The ten (10) tournaments include National Tournaments, National Championships (Trials) and the B.A.S.S. National Qualifier event.

7.9.A.3. National Association team members will be bound by annexure 23: Team Rules.

7.9.B. Regional Team

7.9.B.1. The national selection committee may determine a regional association team, which may consist of any members of the association's regional anglers (irrespective of nationality) who are in good standing in the association and who:

- a) Are in the top of the ranking of the association's regions in the current angling year,
- b) Who have competed in the last national championships.

7.9.B.2. Regional team nomination (if required) will be given (in order of points accumulated) to a regional angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) Current points of the best, as a percentage (out of 100) last three (3) out of eight (8) tournaments fished. This may include tournaments dating back into the previous angling year.

Added to:

b) Points achieved, as a percentage (out of 100) in the last national association championship held.

c) If, by using the prescribed ratios to calculate the scores, anglers are tied on points then the angler that caught the biggest bag out of all ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. If the heaviest bag weights result in another tie then the anglers that caught the heaviest fish during the NBAA ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. The ten (10) tournaments include National Tournaments, National Championships (Trials) and the B.A.S.S. National Qualifier event.

7.9.B.3. The national selection committee shall consult with the regional representatives (if appointed) on the selection of regional team nomination and determination.

7.9.B.4. Regional team members will be bound by annexure 23: Team Rules.

7.9.C. Federation Team

7.9.C.1. The national selection committee may determine a federation team, which may consist of any members of the association anglers (irrespective of nationality) who are in good standing in the association and who:

- a) Are in the top of the ranking of the association in the current angling year,
- b) Who have competed in the last national championships.

7.9.C.2. Federation team nomination (if required) will be given (in order of points accumulated) to an angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) Current points of the best, as a percentage (out of 100) last three (3) out of eight (8) tournaments fished. This may include tournaments dating back into the previous angling year.

Added to:

b) Points achieved, as a percentage (out of 100) in the last national association championship held.

c) If, by using the prescribed ratios to calculate the scores, anglers are tied on points then the angler that caught the biggest bag out of all ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. If the heaviest bag weights result in another tie then the anglers that caught the heaviest fish during the NBAA ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. The ten (10) tournaments include National Tournaments, National Championships (Trials) and the B.A.S.S. National Qualifier event.

7.9.C.3. The association will then, based on the criteria above, apply for federation colours with the Namibia Federation for Freshwater anglers, according to their application procedure.

7.9.C.4. Federation team members will be bound by annexure 23: Team Rules.

7.9.D. International Team Selection Criteria

7.9.D.1. The national selection committee may determine an international association team, which may consist of any members of the association anglers who:

- a) Are in good standing in the association,
- b) Are Namibian citizens
- c) Have participated in at least three (3) of the last eight (8) national tournaments, in the current angling year,
- d) Have competed in the last national trials.

7.9.D.2. International association team nomination (if required) will be given (in order of points accumulated) to an angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) 50% of the points of the best, as a percentage (out of 100), last three (3) out of eight (8) tournaments fished, during a current angling year.

Added to:

- b) 30% of points, as a percentage (out of 100), achieved in the last national trials held during a current angling year.
- c) 20% of points, as a percentage (out of 100), achieved in the best of the last 2 years national trials.

c) If, by using the prescribed ratios to calculate the scores, anglers are tied on points then the angler that caught the biggest bag out of all ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. If the heaviest bag weights result in another tie then the anglers that caught the heaviest fish during the NBAA ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. The ten (10) tournaments include National Tournaments, National Championships (Trials) and the B.A.S.S. National Qualifier event.

7.9.D.3. The national section committee will nominate team members to their respective teams by means of the association team nomination sheet in annexure 15, within thirty (30) days of determination of said team.

7.9.D.4. The national selection committee will determine the team's manager. The respective team will determine its captain and vice-captain.

7.9.D.5. Team participation in any national, non-national or international tournaments, is to be announced to, and sanctioned and approved by the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers and in turn by the Namibian Sports Commission. This includes hosting of events as well as participation in tournaments. Applications for all such are to be done to the Namibia Federation of Freshwater anglers, at least 8 weeks before the start of such tournament or event.

7.9.D.6. Team captains are to submit a full report of the tournament / event addressed to the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers, ten (10) days after the return of the team / participants from said tournament or event.

7.9.D.7. International team members are bound by annexure 8, The Namibia Sports Commission Code of Conduct for Sports Bodies.

7.9.D.8. International team members will be bound by annexure 17: International Team Commitment.

7.9.D.9. International team members will be bound by annexure 23: Team Rules.

7.9.E. B.A.S.S. Nation Competitor Selection (Boater & Non-Boater)

7.9.E.1. The national selection committee may determine a 2-angler association team, irrespective of Nationality which may consist of any members of the association anglers who:

- a) Are in good standing in the association,
- b) Have participated in at least four (4) of the last eight (8) national tournaments, in the current angling year,
- c) Have competed in the last B.A.S.S. Nation Qualifier event.

7.9.E.2. B.A.S.S. Nation Championships team nomination (if required) will be given (in order of points accumulated) to an angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) 50% of the points of the best, last four (4) out of eight (8) tournaments fished, during a current angling year.

Added to:

- b) 25% of points achieved in the last B.A.S.S. Nation Qualifier event held during a current angling year.

- c) 25% of points achieved in the last National Trails event held during a current angling year.

7.9.E.3. The angler with the highest points calculated according to 7.9.E.2. Will be nominated as 'Boater' for the B.A.S.S. Nation Championships to be held in the following calendar year.

7.9.E.4. The angler with the second highest points calculated according to 7.9.E.2. Will be nominated as 'Non-Boater' for the B.A.S.S. Nation Championships to be held in the following calendar year.

7.9.E.5. 'Boaters' and 'Non-Boaters' are to present a report on the Championships and results addressed to the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers, ten (10) days after the return of the team / participants from said tournament or event.

7.9.F. International Team Selection Criteria – FIPSeD/CIPS World Championships

7.9.F.1. The national selection committee may determine an international association team, which may consist of any members of the association anglers who:

- a) Are in good standing in the association,
- b) Are Namibian citizens,
- c) The team manager may be of foreign nationality,
- d) Have participated in at least three (3) of the last eight (8) national tournaments, in the current angling year,
- e) Have competed in the last national trials.

7.9.F.2. International FIPSeD / CIPS World Championships team nomination will be given (in order of points accumulated) to an angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) 50% of the points of the best, as a percentage (out of 100), last three (3) out of eight (8) tournaments fished, during a current angling year.

Added to:

- b) 30% of points, as a percentage (out of 100), achieved in the last national trials held during a current angling year.

- c) 20% of points, as a percentage (out of 100), achieved in the best of the last 2 years national trials.

c) If, by using the prescribed ratios to calculate the scores, anglers are tied on points then the angler that caught the biggest bag out of all ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. If the heaviest bag weights result in another tie then the anglers that caught the heaviest fish during the NBAA ten (10) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. The ten (10) tournaments include National Tournaments, National Championships (Trials) and the B.A.S.S. National Qualifier event.

7.9.F.3. The national section committee will nominate team members to their respective teams by means of the association team nomination sheet in annexure 15, within thirty (30) days of determination of said team.

7.9.F.4. The national selection committee will determine the team's manager. The respective team will determine its captain and vice-captain.

7.9.F.5. Team participation in any FIPsed / CIPS World Championships tournaments, is to be announced to, and sanctioned and approved by the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers and in turn by the Namibian Sports Commission. This includes hosting of events as well as participation in tournaments. Applications for all such are to be done to the Namibia Federation of Freshwater anglers, at least 8 weeks before the start of such tournament or event.

7.9.F.6. Team captains are to submit a full report of the tournament / event addressed to the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers, ten (10) days after the return of the team / participants from said tournament or event.

7.9.F.7. International team members are bound by annexure 8, The Namibia Sports Commission Code of Conduct for Sports Bodies.

7.9.F.8. International team members will be bound by annexure 17: International Team Commitment.

7.9.F.10. International team members will be bound by annexure 23: Team Rules.

7.9.G. International Team Selection Criteria – Junior Region V Team

Junior status is defined in article 10 of the constitution.

7.9.G.1. The national selection committee may determine an international association junior team, which may consist of any members of the association anglers who:

- a) Are in good standing in the association,
- b) Are Namibian citizens,
- c) The team manager / accompanying parents may be of foreign nationality,
- d) Have participated in at least two (2) of the last eight (8) national tournaments, in the current angling year,
- e) Have competed in the last junior national trials.

7.9.G.2. Junior Region V team nomination will be given (in order of points accumulated) to a junior angler, according to the following criteria:

- a) 50% of the points of the best, as a percentage (out of 100), last two (2) out of eight (8) tournaments fished, during a current angling year.

Added to:

b) 50% of points, as a percentage (out of 100), achieved in the last junior national trials held during a current angling year.

c) If, by using the prescribed ratios to calculate the scores, anglers are tied on points then the angler that caught the biggest bag out of all nine (9) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. If the heaviest bag weights result in another tie then the anglers that caught the heaviest fish during the NBAA nine (9) tournaments in the same calendar year will be selected ahead of the other angler. The nine (9) tournaments include National Tournaments and Junior National Trials.

7.9.G.3. The national section committee will nominate team members to their respective teams by means of the association team nomination sheet in annexure 15, within thirty (30) days of determination of said team.

7.9.G.4. The national selection committee will determine the team's manager. The respective team will determine its captain and vice-captain.

7.9.G.5. Team participation in any Junior Region V tournaments, is to be announced to, and sanctioned and approved by the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers and in turn by the Namibian Sports Commission. This includes hosting of events as well as participation in tournaments. Applications for all such are to be done to the Namibia Federation of Freshwater anglers, at least 8 weeks before the start of such tournament or event.

7.9.G.6. Team captains (parents & coaches may assist) are to submit a full report of the tournament / event addressed to the Namibia Federation for Freshwater Anglers, ten (10) days after the return of the team / participants from said tournament or event.

7.9.G.7. International team members are bound by annexure 8, The Namibia Sports Commission Code of Conduct for Sports Bodies.

7.9.G.8. International team members will be bound by annexure 17: International Team Commitment.

7.9.G.10. International team members will be bound by annexure 24: Junior Team Rules.

Team Nomination Sheet (NBAA Constitution Article 7.19.8.)

Nominations for all teams representing the NBAA, shall be done on nomination sheet Annexure 15.

Article 8: Meetings and Quorums

8.1. All association meetings will be held according to the agendas as laid out in Annexure 13.

8.2. Meetings are defined by article 8 of the constitution with additions defined and approved by said meeting within the set parameters.

Article 9: Amateur Status

9.1. Amateur status is defined by article 9 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 10: Junior Status

10.1. Junior status is defined by article 10 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 11: Conservation

11.1. See Annexure 7.

Article 12: Association Property

12.1. 2016 KTE Custom Weigh in Station – including full kit. (NBAA Constitution Article 12)

Article 13: Voting of Members

13.1. Voting of members is defined by article 13 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 14: Association House Rules

14.1. Association House Rules is defined by article 14 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 15: Misconduct

15.1. Notification of a formal disciplinary hearing.

15.4. Misconduct – Action – Penalties – Sentence

Should there be any member who in the opinion of any of the association's committees be guilty of disgraceful conduct, unsportsmanlike conduct, or any transgressions of the rules, regulations, and articles of the constitution, angling rules, or house rules,

The house rules, in co-operation, with all existing infringement, and disqualification rules within the Namibia Bass Angling Association tournament and/or angling rules and regulations, may, authorise the committee to apply a sentence under the house rules that is determined as follows:

15.4.1. First time offenders:

With the scale of infringement of transgression, decided upon, by the committee,

- 15.4.1.1. (0) to (36) month suspension of membership,
- 15.4.1.2. (N\$ 0.00) to (N\$ 1,000.00) fine,
- 15.4.1.3. or both.

15.4.2. Second time or multiple offenders:

With the scale of infringement of transgression, decided upon, by the committee,

- 15.4.2.1. (36) month suspension, or
- 15.4.2.2. Termination of membership, or
- 15.4.2.3. (N\$ 1,000.00) to (N\$ 10,000.00) fine,
- 15.4.2.4. or both.

15.4.3. Angling members representing their country at international level:

- 15.4.3.1. Loss of membership, and
- 15.4.3.2. Report of offence to the Namibia Sports Commission.

Article 16: Amendment of the Articles of the Constitution

16.1. Amendment of the Articles of the Constitution is defined by article 16 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 17: Association Trophies

- 17.1. Angler of the Year Trophy – seniors
- 17.2. Team of the Year Trophy
- 17.3. All time Bass Record Trophy
- 17.4. Ladies Angler of the Year Trophy
- 17.5. Biggest Bass of the Year Trophy
- 17.6. Junior Biggest Bass of the Year Trophy
- 17.7. All time Bag Record Trophy
- 17.8. Biggest Bag of the Year Trophy
- 17.9. Angler of the Year Trophy – juniors
- 17.10. Corporate Bass Challenge Team Winners Trophy
- 17.11. Corporate Bass Challenge Biggest Bass Trophy
- 17.12. National Champion Trophy

Article 18: Association Tournaments, Tournament Objectives, Rules and Regulations

All tournaments, including national tournaments, national championships, national trials and / or tournaments organized by the association and / or tournaments organized by third parties and held under the endorsement of the Namibia Bass Angling Association, will herein under be referred to as: “NBAA tournaments”, “tournaments” and / or “angling tournaments”.

Tournaments in the association will be defined as, but may not be limited to:

18.1. National Tournaments: Eight (8) national tournaments will be held within an angling year. These will be held at venues as determined by the executive management committee. The executive management committee sets all dates and venues, for all national tournaments, at the beginning of the angling year. Changes in dates and / or venues, as decided by the executive management committee made known to all members, at least fourteen (14) days before a said tournament.

18.2. Regional Tournament(s): May take place from time to time within an angling year and are based on regional representation, with regions as described in 5.5. above, competing against each other. The executive management committee sets a date / dates for the regional tournament(s) at the beginning of an angling year. The venue for the regional tournament(s) is determined, by a draw, at least 4 days before the start of the regional tournament(s). Regional Tournaments may coincide with other association tournaments or events.

18.3. National Championships: One (1) national championship tournament will be held within an angling year and may coincide with the national trials tournament. The executive management committee sets a date for the national championship at the beginning of an angling year. The venue for the national championships is determined, by a draw, at least four (4) days before the start of the national championship. National championships may coincide with national trials (18.4).

18.4. National Trials: One (1) national trials tournament will be held within an angling year and may coincide with the national championship tournament. The executive management committee sets a date for the national trials at the beginning of an angling year. The venue for the national trials is determined, by a draw, at least four (4) days before the start of the national trials.

A commissioner from the Namibian Sports Commission must be invited, in writing to National Trials being held, stating the date, time and place of these trials. This invitation must have reached the Namibian Sports Commission at least fourteen (14) days before the trials are being held. This official invitation by the association will be addressed to the “Chief Commissioner of the Namibian Sports Commission” and be forwarded to the Namibian Federation for Freshwater Anglers. This procedure will enable the Commissioner from the Namibian Sports Commission to certify and declare the hosted trials as being legal and fair.

18.5. Junior National Trials: One (1) junior national trials tournament will be held within an angling year. The executive management committee sets a date for the national trials at the beginning of an angling year. The venue for the national trials is determined, by a draw, at least four (4) days before the start of the junior national trials.

A commissioner from the Namibian Sports Commission must be invited, in writing to Junior National Trials being held, stating the date, time and place of these trials. This invitation must have reached the Namibian Sports Commission at least fourteen (14) days before the trials are being held. This official invitation by the association will be addressed to the “Chief Commissioner of the Namibian Sports Commission” and be forwarded to the Namibian Federation for Freshwater Anglers. This procedure

will enable the Commissioner from the Namibian Sports Commission to certify and declare the hosted trials as being legal and fair.

18.6 Pro-Am Style National Event: One (1) pro-am format trails tournament may be held within an angling year and may not coincide with the national championships / national trials tournament. The executive management committee sets a date for the national trials at the beginning of the angling year. The venue for the national trials is determined, by a draw, at least four (4) days before the start of the pro-am style event. This event, along with other criteria will be used to determine the angler who will represent Namibia in the USA. This event can coincide with the B.A.S.S. Nation Qualifier Championships.

18.7. B.A.S.S. Nation Qualifier Championships: One (1) B.A.S.S. Nation Qualifier tournament will be held within an angling year. The executive management committee sets a date for the event at the beginning of an angling year. The venue for the event is determined, by a draw, at least four (4) days before the start of the event. This event can coincide with the Pro-Am Style National Event.

18.8. International Tournaments: May take place from time to time within an angling year, based on invitations received from other countries, invitations extended to other countries, other bodies and / or other organizations. These may include, but are not limited to association tournaments, federation tournaments; club organized tournaments (inside or outside of Namibia) and / or international tournaments.

18.9. Apart from the association's tournament objectives, rules and regulations laid out in the association's constitution and house rules, the association's tournament objectives, rules and regulations shall be laid out as follows:

Article 19: Indemnity and Liability

19.1. See association indemnity and liability form annexure 3.

Article 20: Interpretation

20.1. 'Interpretation' is defined by article 20 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 21: Anti-Doping

21.1. 'Anti-Doping' is defined by article 21 of the constitution with no additions.

Article 22: Dissolution and Winding up the Affairs of the Association

22.1. 'Dissolution and Winding up the Affairs of the Association' is defined by article 22 of the constitution with no additions.
