NBAA NATIONAL TEAM 2015

CAPTAINS REPORT

REGION 5 BASS FEDERATION ANGLING TOURNAMENT – LAKE CHICAMBA - MANICA PROVINCE - MOZAMBIQUE

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

The Namibian Bass Angling Association (NBAA) National Team took part in the Region 5 Bass Federation Angling Tournament, dated 27th July 2015 to 31st July 2015.

This year was the eighth (8) year in succession, that the NBAA has selected a national team and participated in the Region 5 Bass Federation Tournament. The Region 5 Bass Federation Tournament is hosted by a different country each year and this year the tournament is again to be held on Lake Chicamba, in Mozambique.

Located approximately 200 kilometres west-north-west of the city of Beira, Lake Chicamba is located in the Manica province of Mozambique, not far from the Zimbabwe border city of Mutare. The lake, which is an important supplier of hydroelectricity in the region, was completed in 1968 and filled in the early 70's. With a surface area when full of 160 square kilometres and a capacity of around 2 billion cubic metres this dam occupies a surface area approximately five and a half times the size of Hardap dam, near Mariental. Lake Chicamba is known for very large specimens of largemouth bass (Micropterus salmoides), with numerous fish over 7 kg's having been caught. The current, official, Namibian open record was smashed by Max Pieper at Lake Chicamba in 2013, raising the old record form 5.02 kg to a monstrous 6.42 kg.

All teams arrived at Lake Chicamba Real on Saturday the 25th of July 2015. Monday and Tuesday were set aside for all national teams to pre-fish this venue. This enabled the teams to get to know the waters and the fishing conditions a little better. The official competition then ran for the following three days.

The Region 5 Bass Federation Tournament is currently the largest international bass fishing competition held in Africa, with six (6) countries participating. Namibia, South Africa, Zimbabwe, Swaziland, Zambia and Mozambique took part in this prestigious event.

The Namibian Team of 2015 was haunted on the 2200km journey, by numerous mechanical breakdowns and mechanical issues on their boats and even had medically related issues affecting some team members, even before the tournament started. Broken down Vehicles, broken boat trailers and even two (2) defective boat motors plagued the team shortly after their arrival in Mozambique. These issues obviously affected the young and relatively inexperienced Namibian team negatively and put Namibia on the back foot right from the start of the tournament. Team Namibia anticipated the tournament to be won on "off-shore" and open water bite conditions, as it had in 2013.

Team Namibia thus lacked the experience to capitalize on the very early pre-spawn bite pattern, which the more experienced teams from South Africa, Zimbabwe, Zambia and Mozambique figured out very early.

Zimbabwe, Zambia and Mozambique call lake Chicamba their home lake and thus these teams were expected to do well.

In the end it was the mighty experienced team from South Africa however, who managed to find new, prespawn fish every day of the three (3) day tournament and thus managed to snatch the champions title. The full results are shown in attachment.

Material breakdowns can and will hamper your fishing ability but the experience gained, included how to catch early, pre-spawn fish in a dam that is littered with cover, but that offers very little cover and even less hard bottom (spawning bottom). Ditch, anthill and deep standing timer fishing is something that Namibian's are not versed in
