Public Relations Officer Report 2017

Although we had a very good rainy season this year with both Von Bach and Oanob getting substantial inflow, it was a tough year for bass fishing. After a severe drought lasting for a couple of years the eco systems of both Von Bach and Oanob will take some time to recover.

Cancelled Events

Due to unfortunate circumstances, the NBAA once again had to take make the tough decision to cancel the Winter Bass Classic and the renowned Summer Bass Classic. The cancellation of the Summer Bass Classic always has a very negative effect on the fundraising for the NBAA budget; it is also one of the best attended events for the NBAA with very active media coverage provided by Radiowave, giving the NBAA and bass fishing tremendous exposure to the public.

NBAA Golf Day

The NBAA hosted 2 golf days this year. The first was held on the 2nd of June at Rossmund Golf Course in Swakopmund. It is the first time that this event was hosted and turned out to be very successful.

On the 30th of June the NBAA hosted its annual golf day at the Windhoek Country Club. It was an extremely successful event. A total of 22 teams attended the event. Pietman die Skot was a special guest at the event. The auction was also very successful and the NBAA managed to raise some well needed funds.

Corporate Bass Challenge




Social Media (Facebook): The NBAA has a Facebook page on which events are posted and awareness raised. Here are some interesting statistics for 2017:

Raffle: The NBAA held its first ever raffle with some great prizes that were up for grabs. The initiative was a great success and successfully raised some funds for the NBAA.






Likes have increased from 700 to a total of 069 during 2017

Baarsspan sien kans vir enigiemand

'n Namibiese hengelspan ding dié week in die 13de Black Bass wêreldkampioenskap mee wat gister begin het en tot komende Sondag duur.

Die Suid-Afrikaanse Baarshengelvereniging tree as die gasheer op vir die geleentheid wat oor 'n gebied van 52 kilometer lank op die Vaalrivier aangebied word.

Die byeenkoms is die wêreld se grootste internasionale spankompetisie in baarshengel en geniet groot internasionale aansien. Spanne van Suid-Afrika, Zimbabwe, Zambië, Swaziland, die VSA, Kroasië, Duitsland, Italië, Mexiko, Rusland, Portugal, Spanje en Namibië ding mee.

Dit is die eerste keer dat Namibië die kans aangryp om deel te neem – grootliks vanweë die hoë reiskoste om spanne na vorige gasheerlande in Europa of Sentraal-Amerika te stuur.

Uit die vyf dae van die byeenkoms is twee oefendae uitgesit, voor die drie dae van amptelike kompetisie.

Die stelsel van puntetoekenning is anders as waaraan die Namibiërs gewoond is. Elkeen van die drie dae se kompetisie is afsonderlik en dit gaan nie oor elke span se totale gewig, soos waaraan die Namibiese hengelaars gewoond is nie.

Elke span het drie bote met twee hengelaars op die water. In die Grand Prix-puntestelsel word spanwerk beloon en dit is van deurslaggewende belang dat elke Namibiese boot op elke kompetisiedag minstens vyf visse uittrek. Kommunikasie op die water is belangrik en die spankaptein het ook 'n sentrale rol.

Die Namibiese span vir die week is Alec Williams (kaptein), Jacques Marais, Max Pieper, Richard Grant, Anton de Wit, Ricardo Abrantes, Jürgen Geiger (reserwe) en André van Vuuren (spanbestuurder).

Die Namibiese span berei reeds vir maande voor en is gereed om die voorste hengelaars in die wêreld die stryd aan te sê. Die meeste spanlede het reeds voor die amptelike spertyd na die venue vertrek om op die Vaalrivier te gaan oefen. Ons oefensessies was uiters waardevol en het ons spanlede baie selfvertroue gegee, het Richard Grant, nasionale spanlid en voorsitter van die Namibiese Baarshengelvereniging, gesê.

Hengelspan vestig hom as wêreldklas

Met Namibië se heel eerste deelname aan die pas afgelope 13de wêreldkampioenskap in baarshengel, was die nasionale span heel tevrede om in 'n respektabele sewende plek uit 13 lande te kon eindig.

Die wêreldwye spogbyeenkoms vir die sport is op die Vaalrivier deur die Suid-Afrikaanse Baarshengelvereniging (SABAA) aangebied.

Elke span het drie bote met twee hengelaars elk in die veld gestoot vir die kompetisie wat oor 'n gebied van 52 kilometer op die rivier gehou is.

Deelnemers was hoogs beindruk met die puik reëlings van die toernooi wat selfs eerstewêreldlande se vorige aanbiedings oortref het. Die mediadekking het selfs volledige regstreekse videostroom op prominente YouTube-kanale soos FLWFishing en Just Fishing ingesluit, wat elke deel van die hengelwêreld bereik het. Hengelaars en organiseerders was dus vol lof vir wat die SABAA onder leierskap van Craig Fraser vermag het.

Die Namibiese span het uit Alec Williams (kaptein), Jacques Marais, Max Pieper, Richard Grant, Anton de Wit, Ricardo Abrantes, Jurgen Geiger (reserwe) en André van Vuuren (bestuurder) bestaan.

Die Namibiërs se besluit om twee weke vooraf op die Vaalrivier te gaan oefen, het vrugte afgewerp met die ondervinding en plaaslike kennis wat goud werd was.

Ná twee amptelike oefendae het die kompetisie van drie dae begin. Die eerste kompetisiedag was egter die heeldag koud en reënerig en toestande op die Vaalrivier was dus veel anders as tydens die vorige oefensessies.

Die Namibiërs het nogtans nooit besgegee nie en elke boot het daarin geslaag om sy limiet vir die dag te vang. Namibië het dus die eerste dag in die algehele vyfde plek afgesluit – selfs voor die Amerikaners.

Toestande op die tweede dag was gunstiger, maar die verandering in die barometer en die bootverkeer wat visse ál meer sku maak, het meegebring dat hengelaars dit steeds nie maklik gehad het nie.

Met goeie spanwerk het die Namibiërs wel hul limiet in elke boot gehaal, maar 'n ongelukkige terugslag was dat een boot se swaarste vis gevrek het minute voordat dit ingeweeg sou word. Dit het Namibië tot agtste laat terugsak.



Op dag drie het die weersomstandighede verder verswak. Nogtans het die Namibiese bote hul sakke vol gevang en die dag in die vyfde posisie afgesluit, wat hul algehele plek in die toernooi op sewende te staan gebring het.

Namibië se beste boot (Max Pieper en Ricardo Abrantes) het in die individuele kompetisie in die vierde plek geëindig. Pieper se beste vangs van 2.28 kg was ook die vierde swaarste vis van die toernooi.

Die deelnemende lande se hengelspanne het soos volg geëindig: 1. Suid-Afrika, 2. VSA, 3. Italië, 4. Spanje, 5. Zambië, 6. Zimbabwe, 7. Namibië, 8. Duitsland, 9. Swaziland, 10. Mexiko, 11. Portugal, 12. Rusland, 13. Kroasië

The Namibian Team departed for Claw Dam on the 20th of July 2017. It was a 3 day journey from Namibia, through Botswana to Kadoma in Zimbabwe covering a total of almost 1800km.

The team arrived at Claw Dam on Saturday afternoon the 22nd of July. The Kadoma Angling Club put a lot of effort into the camping facilities making the team's stay there very comfortable and enjoyable. The catering company did a sterling job with providing food for all the countries and the boat packs were fantastic.

The Region 5 tournament is usually attended by 6 countries namely Zimbabwe, South Africa, Namibia, Zambia, Mozambique and Swaziland but due to unfortunate circumstances Swaziland had to withdraw this year. This gave a total of 30 boats competing on the water.

The tournament was officially opened on Sunday the 23rd of July with two practice days and the official tournament starting on the 26th, one could feel the excitement in the air. The comaradary amongst the countries was amazing with some very good friendships built up over the years.

During practice days the team was divided up into different areas of the dam, each boat looking for and marking structure on their electronics, pitching a bait into certain spots checking if the fish was their but taking extra care not to get a hook up. It is very important not to "sting" a fish during practice as they tend to go off the bite when caught.

Namibia was in 5th position after day 1 due to the total weight of our fish being less than the other countries. Total weight for the day was 138.86kg and a total of 136 fish

Namibia moved into 4th position after day 2. Total weight for the day was 135.62kg and a total of 140 fish

Zambia 22 fish

South Africa 29 fish Zimbabwe 30 fish

Namibia was still in 4th position after day 3 Total weight for the day was 113kg and a total of 124 fish

The total amount of fish caught for the tournament was 400 with a total weight of 387.48kg

Bass anglers seventh at World Champs

NAMIBIA finished seventh out of 13 countries at the 13th Black Bass World Championships, which were hosted by South Africa on the Vaal River from 2 to 8 October.

It was the first time that Namibia had competed at an event of such magnitude, and they gave a fine performance at the world's biggest team bass angling tournament.

Each country had three boats on the water with two anglers each, while the tournament was held on a 52km stretch of water on the river.

The Namibian team went to practise at the venue two weeks before the cut-off date, which gave them valuable experience before the start of the tournament.

The world championships consisted of five days of angling, which included two days of practice, and three days of competition.

On the first day of competition, the team encountered rainy conditions with very cold weather, with the rain coming down non-stop from 06h00 to 10h00. Team Namibia was cold and wet, but continued to fish in the miserable conditions. The hard work thus paid off as all the Namibian boats managed to catch their limit for the day while the country finished fifth overall, ahead of angling powerhouse the United States.

The second day saw much better weather, but fishing became more difficult, mainly due to boat pressure and the change in the barometer. One of the Namibian boats had further misfortune as their biggest fish died a few minutes before the weigh-in, with the result that Namibia moved

down to eighth place overall. The weather once again took a turn for the worse on the final day, but Team Namibia managed to fill their bag limits to finish fifth on the day, and seventh overall.

One of the Namibian boats, with Max Pieper and Ricardo Abrantes on board, came fourth overall in the individual standings, while Pieper also caught the fourth-biggest fish of the tournament, weighing in at 2,26kg.

South Africa were the overall winners, with the United States coming second and Italy third.

They were followed by Spain, Zambia and Zimbabwe, and then Namibia. According to

Andrew Hall, the PRO of the Namibia Bass Angling Association, the organisation of the tournament was impeccable.

"The media coverage was phenomenal, with live updates being broadcast all over the world, including on the famous FLW Youtube channel. Each day's full weigh-in was broadcast live on the web, and fans tuned in from all corners of the globe," he beamed.

Press Release

The Namibia Bass Angling Association regrettably would like to inform the public that the 2017 Radiowave Summer Bass Classic which was scheduled to take place at the end of October has been postponed to 2018 due to the fact that S. Von Bach Dam has not yet recovered from the effects of the devastating drought that Namibia experienced over the last couple of years.

S. Von Bach dam was at a mere 9% in December of 2016. Fortunately there was considerable inflow since December in the form of the good rains that Namibia experienced coupled with the water which Namwater has been pumping to S. Von Bach from Omatako Dam and S. Von Bach currently stands at over 70%. Unfortunately even though S. Von Bach is reasonably full the eco-system is in a state of repair and will take time to recover fully.

The NBAA is extremely conservation orientated and feel that putting additional pressure on our most important resource would most certainly not aid the recovery process and as a result of all of the above have made the decision to cancel the 2017 event.

Bank Windhoek National Tournament #1 25th of February 2017 Lake Oanob

The NBAA hosted the 1st Bank Windhoek National Tournament for 2017 at picturesque Lake Oanob, 90km south of Windhoek on the 25th of February 2017. Anglers were all excited to start the new season. The turn-out for the tournament was fantastic with no less than 5 new anglers, 3 returning anglers that did not compete due to the drought in 2016 and 4 ladies competing of which one was a junior. The NBAA is excited to physically see the growth in the sport and is aiming to take bass angling in Namibia to new exciting levels.





Namibia was blessed with great rains at the beginning of February that pushed Lake Oanob from 25% to 80% with in the space of 3 weeks. This inflow is fantastic for the future of Bass fishing in Namibia however it made the first Tournament extremely difficult with only 6 fish coming to the scales.

Jandre Engelbrecht Caught the biggest fish of the tournament which was subsequently big enough to win the tournament as well. The fish weighed an impressive 3.676kg (8 lbs 10 oz.) and can be considered to be a 'wall hanger'. Nic Kruger caught a giant too weighing in at 3.02kg (6 lbs 7 oz.) which turned out to be the second biggest fish of the day. Alec Williams caught his fish, a respectable specimen of 2.051kg, in injury time just before the tag board closed, earning him valuable points in the always closely contested 'Angler of the Year' race.

For the anglers out there that want to catch a giant bass at Lake Oanob, the two giants were both caught on a white and chartreuse spinner bait. Try it; you might just get a giant surprise.



artorius von Bach or more commonly known as Von Bach Dam is nestled elegantly in the bush, covering an area of 4.89km² and on occasion offers the sighting of some early morning antelope having a drink at the water's edge. This is Namibia's oldest bass fishery and an absolute paradise to any bass angler. Von Bach is a rock filled impoundment in the Swakop River catchment system, the dam has a total lack of aquatic vegetation. The Swakop River is the main river feeding to the dam. The average precipitation for this area is about 410mm per year.

Von Bach is the primary water source of Windhoek and Okahandja and has a total capacity of 48.560 million cubic meters. The dam has faced some tough conditions during the drought the last couple of years and hit a low of about 9% before the rainy season started in December 2016. Since then the dam has received quite a bit of inflow and stood at 42.8% end of February 2017 with some good rain prediction still ahead.

There are a multitude of fish species in Von Bach namely, carp (Cyprinus carpio), African sharptooth catfish (Clarias gariepinus), our beloved largemouth friends (Micropterus salmoides), straightfin barb (Barbus paludinosus), blue curper (Oreochromis mossambicus) and redbreasted curper (Tilapia rendalli). Bass was introduced to Von Bach in the 1970's by the Ministry of Fisheries to control the expanding carp population. This dam has evolved into a unique eco system over the last 47 years with some exceptional bass fishing. The last Zone-6 tournament held on Von Bach yielded a catch of about 450 fish for the tournament, truly a memorable event to every angler that attended.

As autumn starts we enter into a very exciting time for bass fishing at Von Bach. Water temperatures slowly start to decrease which causes the baitfish to move into the shallow waters in the back of bays. Bass follow this baitfish into the back of these bays and it is here where they will be most commonly found in the autumn months. Bass

baitfish as closely as possible.

become active during this period as they start to feed for the upcoming winter and prey on almost anything. It is during this time that the faster moving baits work exceptionally well. The number one bait for Von Bach during this period is a lipless crankbait. You will surely bag a few beauties with this bait as well as some catfish in the process. A couple of alternative baits to consider that also work well during this period are jerkbaits, square bill crank baits for those shallows as well as regular crankbaits to cover the deeper water. The colour of choice would be canary kurper or any natural colours that mimic the

As mentioned earlier Von Bach has little to no aquatic vegetation and majority of the bass relate to rock structures and piles. There are a few dead trees but these are usually only submerged during high water levels after a good rainy season. Any of these submerged trees and stick ups are also good places to go hunting for bass and are sure to produce a fine specimen or two. Alternative places to target for bass would be tapering rock points that have access to deeper water, boat docks in shallower water as well as river channels and edges. The bigger fish start moving into the shallow waters once the water temperature reaches about 20°C. As autumn progresses and water temperatures drop even lower it is recommended to downsize your baits for the most effective fishing.

The dam offers its visitors the option of camping or luxury chalet accommodation. There is also a restaurant available to guests.

If you are ever in the area, make sure to schedule a fishing trip to Von Bach to make this dam part of one of your most memorable bass fishing destinations.

I caught my fish on mojo baby brush hog june bug 3/16 oz sinker. My strategy was to cover as much water as possible.

Willem's summary of the day is as follows:

Bait: Terminator, willow leaf spinnerbait in gold and silver, brown and white skirt.

Strategy: Concentrated efforts mainly on rock piles / rock ridges where there was a slight chop (waves) on the water.

Technique: Casted the spinnerbait out to the shoreline grass and bush and retrieved it slowly. Once out of the bush or grass line, I slowed down even more and fish the spinnerbait yo-yo with long pauses.

I caught one fish in the grass line, the other fish picked up the spinnerbait on the drop of the yo-yo.

I switched to plastics in the afternoon as there was no wind movement.





Gregg's summary of the day is as follows:

I prefished the dam and concentrated on the cleaner water. I thought we had found some sort of pattern pitching plastics a few weeks prior to the event. However as the dirty water cleaned up close to the event I think a number of fish moved back into the main section of the dam. The day of the event I continued in the cleaner water and focused on the grass lines and points. It was quickly evident that the fishing had deteriorated. I practically threw the kitchen sink and managed to get one to commit to a baby bass spook. Fortunately it was a better one.
